'Intermezzo' can be seen as an umbrella term under which Brahms could collect anything which he regarded as neither capricious nor passionate. He completed these pieces during his

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summer holiday in Ischl, Upper Austria, in 1893, the first intermezzo being written in May and the following three pieces in June.

Nonetheless, the individual pieces, especially the A-major Intermezzo, No. 2, have become very popular in their own right and are effective individual miniatures. All of Brahms's remaining solo piano output would be devoted to such pieces: the two sets from this period, Opp. 76 and 79, and then the very late outpouring in Opp. 116-119. In these pieces, Brahms was as generic as possible with his titles, wishing to avoid programmatic associations.

Intermezzo in A Minor op. 76 no. 7 was written in 1878 by Johannes Brahms. Brahms was a composer and pianist of the Romantic era of western art music. (You can read more about western art music in my article here.) He was born in Germany in 1833, and died in Vienna in 1897. An intermezzo is a short composition, usually written for a solo instrument.

I love this piece, and I feel your harmonic analysis leaves out

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most of what makes it wonderful. It's a duet - tender lovers, I think, - and really needs to be understood as dealing with sorrow and love. The "Ab" section is the most explicit love making Brahms ever wrote, less aggressive than his rival Wagner, much more tender and warm.

Consistent with Brahms's other late keyboard works, Op. 118 is more introspective than his earlier piano pieces, which tended to be more virtuosic in character. The six pieces are: Intermezzo in A minor. Allegro non assai, ma molto appassionato; Intermezzo in A major. Andante teneramente; Ballade in G minor. Allegro energico; Intermezzo in F minor.
