Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) is the third leading cause of

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death worldwide, causing 3.23 million deaths in 2019 [1]. Over 80% of these deaths occurred in low- and middle-income countries (LMIC). COPD causes persistent and progressive respiratory symptoms, including difficulty in breathing, cough and/or phlegm production.
