Persons 18 years and older are referred to the KC-ATC by the Kansas City Police Department or approved area hospital emergency departments. No walk-ins are accepted. A nurse and licensed team leader will immediately triage each individual - this includes a comprehensive mental health assessment, shower, change of clothes and a meal.

The Australasian Triage Scale (ATS) is a clinical tool used to establish the maximum waiting time for medical assessment and treatment of a patient. The ATS aims to ensure that patients presenting to emergency departments (EDs) are treated in the order of their clinical urgency and allocated to the most appropriate assessment and treatment area.

The triage nurse performs a brief, focused assessment and assigns the patient a triage acuity level, which is a proxy measure of how long an individual patient can safely wait for a medical screening examination and treatment.

On arrival to the Emergency Department, you will be assessed on the urgency of your condition by an emergency specialist nurse called a Triage Nurse. As soon as possible you will be taken to a cubicle where you will be assessed by a member of the Emergency Department team and specialist
