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Elements of Set Theory []
Assume that x and y are members of a set B . Show that { { x } , { x , y } } ∈ PP B . Since x and y are members of B , it follows that { x } ⊆ B and { x , y } ⊆ B . So { x } and { x , y } ∈ P B , and thus { { x } , { x , y } } ⊆ P B , so { { x } , { x , y } } ∈ PP B . Define the rank of a set c to be the least α such that c ⊆ V α .
