All parents and students have certain rights in schools when it comes to things like access to student records, discipline, and discrimination (link to student rights article). Students with disabilities and their parents have additional rights under several laws, including the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act

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(IDEA).

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The IDEA statute is codified at 20 U.S.C. 1401 et seq. and the IDEA statute is cited above by its public law sections (i.e., Sec. 612 is 20 U.S.C. 1412). The IDEA regulations are codified in 34 CFR Part 300 (for the 2006 IDEA Part B regulations) and 34 CFR Part 303 (for the IDEA Part C regulations).

Individuals With Disabilities Education Act

As part of their responsibilities required by IDEA, every state must issue state rules or regulations that provide guidance on the implementation of IDEA within the state. At a minimum, state regulations must provide all of the protections contained in IDEA. Some states have additional regulatory requirements that go beyond IDEA.
