By means of praeteritio, a rhetorical device implemented by a speaker to mention a certain thing while claiming not to mention it, Antony alerts the plebeians to the fact that Caesar cared greatly for them: "It is not meet [fitting] you know how Caesar loved you... 'Tis good you know not that you are his heirs" (III.ii. 138 - 142).
