John Eliot Gardiner's first recording of Orfeo ed Euridice was, strangely enough, of Berlioz's 19th-century edition, using modern instruments and the forces of Lyons Opera. Jaroussky's program notes state that his affinity for 17th century Italian opera led him to conceive and construct this "Orfeo ed Euridice" as "a kind of opera in miniature or as a cantata for two solo voices." This version of the Orpheus myth is focused only on the two title characters and curated from music by seven composers.

The work that changed opera history. Christoph Willibald Gluck was a cosmopolitan in the true sense of the word: born in Bavaria, musically trained in Milan, resident and actively working in both Vienna and Paris, as well as spending time in Prague as a student. His Orfeo ed Euridice was originally performed in Italian in Vienna in 1762 and is considered the first of his "reform" operas.
