### Information on Native Students - National Indian Education ...

There are approximately 644,000 American Indian and Alaska Native students in the US K-12 system, representing 1.2 percent of public school students nationally . Ninety percent of Native students attend public schools, while eight percent attend schools administered by the Bureau of Indian Education (BIE).

Native American Students in Higher Education Because Native Americans (both American Indians and Alaska Natives) comprise only 1% of the U.S. undergraduate population and less than 1% of the graduate population, these students are often left out of postsecondary research and data reporting due to small sample size.
