Assume that each time a training example is drawn, it comes from an identical distribution (i.i.d) Assume that the test examples are drawn in exactly the same way - i.i.d. and from the same distribution as the training data. These assumptions make it very unlikely that a strong regularity in the training data will be absent in the test data.
