Most skin cancers are caused by too much exposure to ultraviolet (UV) rays. UV rays come from the sun, tanning beds, and sunlamps. UV rays can damage skin cells. In the book Hypothyroidism: The Unsuspected Illness thyroid pioneer Dr. Broda Barnes wrote, “When thyroid function is low, circulation is reduced. Arterial conditions, such as peripheral artery disease (PAD) and critical limb ischemia (CLI), and venous conditions, such as deep venous disease (DVD) and superficial venous insufficiency (SVI) can produce notable changes in the skin, especially on the legs and feet.. Changes in the texture and color of the skin are a result of poor circulation in the arteries and veins.2,3,4

Bowen's disease. Bowen's disease is a very early form of squamous cell skin cancer. It's also called squamous cell carcinoma in situ. It's a very slow growing cancer. Doctors call Bowen's disease pre invasive. That means that there are cancer cells there, but they are only in the outermost layer of skin, the epidermis.

Signs of lower extremity arterial disease include open sores on the legs or feet. They sometimes develop from a minor injury or scratch. Poor circulation in the leg can lead to dry skin that cracks. Because small cuts and cracked skin do not receive adequate blood flow to heal properly, bacteria can enter them, causing an infection.
