Hurricane Frances was the second most intense tropical cyclone in the Atlantic during 2004 and proved to be very destructive in Florida.It was the sixth named storm, the fourth hurricane, and the third major hurricane of the 2004 Atlantic hurricane season.The system crossed the open Atlantic in late August, moving to the north of the Lesser Antilles while strengthening.
