The Sioux people refer to the Great Sioux Nation as the Očhéthi Šakówiŋ (pronounced [o'tʃ^het^hi ja'kowĩ], meaning "Seven Council Fires"). Each fire is a symbol of an oyate (people or nation). Today the seven nations that comprise the Očhéthi Šakówiŋ are the Thítuŋwaŋ (also known collectively as the Teton or Lakota), Bdewákaŋtuŋwaŋ, Waŋpéthuŋwaŋ, Waŋpékhute, and ...
